Together with the City of Santa Fe and the RedfishGroup, SFI hosted a Seminar entitled "Computational Methods for Wildfire Evacuation Modeling and Planning." The talk was introduced with a local project between the City of Santa Fe and the RedfishGroup modeling traffic on the Santa Fe road network and wildfire dynamics on the local topology. City officials held an informal breakout session following the talk to discuss potential research directions in evacuation dynamics.

## ULAM LECTURES — SEPTEMBER 12, 13, & 14

Nina Fedoroff (Evan Pugh Professor, Willaman Professor of Life Sciences, Pennsylvania State University and SFI External Professor) has recently been in residence at SFI pursuing her research. She will be giving the Ulam lectures this year, a continuing lecture series dedicated to the memory of the great mathematician Stanislaw Ulam of the now legendary Polish School of Mathematics. Upon his passing in 1984, Françoise, his wife, donated his entire book collection to the SFI Library. Françoise lives in Santa Fe and usually attends the lectures. They will be held on September 12, 13, and 14, at the James A. Little Theater beginning at 7:30 pm Tuesday, September 12, 2006.

#### Tuesday, September 12, 2006

Lecture I: How Plants See, Feel, and Smell: The Perceptual Apparatus of the Plant Kingdom

Plants sense light, touch, gravity, humidity, and the myriad chemicals they encounter in the air and soil. The first lecture describes how plants perceive these signals and respond by moving and changing the way they grow, progressing from the whole plant down to its cells and molecules.

#### Wednesday, September 13, 2006

Lecture II: The Jumping Genome: Changing Ideas about Heredity and Evolution

Genetics traces its origins to monk Gregor Mendel's experiments on common pea plants. The 20th century witnessed the explosive growth of genetics from the naming of genes to the identification of DNA as the stuff of heredity by Nobel Laureates Watson and Crick to the sequencing of whole genomes. The second lecture explores the revolutions in ideas of genes and chromosomes from beads on a string to the jumping corn genes of Nobel Laureate Barbara McClintock to contemporary ideas of a dynamic genome.

#### Thursday, September 14, 2006

Lecture III: Genetically Modified Foods: Monsters or Miracles?

We're bombarded with conflicting claims about genetically modified (GM) foods. Some claim that they will provide the food to sustain humanity on an increasingly crowded planet. Others claim they're toxic to people and the environment. What are we to believe? The third lecture examines the history of food plants, describes the differences between previous and present methods of modifying them, and addresses common food safety and biodiversity concerns about GM crops and foods.

# IP FELLOW VEDRES RETURNS TO SFI

International Fellow **Balazs Vedres**, of the Department of Sociology and Social Anthropology, Central European University, returned to SFI to continue his research on exploring methods to analyze the dynamics of network cohesion, to develop an approach to classify sequences in the lives of cohesive groups (such as mergers, split-ups, emergence and dissolution). Balazs uses a dataset of the board interlock network of the 2000 largest Hungarian firms from 1987 to 2001 to find links between business group sequences and political intervention.
